Members discussed about the leaves sanctioned by the colleges towards University assigned duties and requested to consider the University assigned duties as OOD. Dr.Prashanth C. S member of senate requested the chair that All university appointments assigned to faculty of affiliated institutions to be considered as deputation/On Official duty & not against any other personal / academic (special casual leave) available for credit of such faculty any deviations/ discrepancies of the same shall be attributed as explainable by the Head of such affiliated institution and communication regarding this to be circulated among all the affiliated colleges. Dr. Sridhar P V, Dr. Sharan J Shetty and other members also opined the same. Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor informed the members that all University assigned duties to be considered as OOD and communication regarding this will be circulated among all the affiliated colleges

Member Kalmath, of Senate Somashekharayya Mr. welfare fund/trust" regarding "faculty requested Hon'ble chair for the implementation. Shri S. Kumar Bangarappa, Member of Senate suggested for incorporating the guidelines framed under CM Relief Fund by the Government of Karnataka for implementation of "faculty Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor informed the welfare fund/trust". members that after verifying the feasibility of the faculty welfare fund/trust necessary action will be taken.

Members discussed about uniform pay scale for the faculties among all the affiliated colleges of RGUHS. Shri S. Kumar of Senate, informed to seek Member Bangarappa, administrative opinion. Dr. Anand S. Kirishal, Dr Aishwarya K.C and Dr. Chandrashekar Kuppi, members of senate deliberated on the issue and submitted their opinion regarding the difficulties faced by the private college managements in implementing the uniform pay scale for the faculties. Dr Manoj kumar H.V explained about the administrative hurdles in implementing uniform pay scale. Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor informed the members that University has only affiliated colleges and University role and authority in fixing the pay scale is not clear. Hence, it was decided to seek legal opinion regarding University role and authority in implementing uniform pay scale for faculties working in affiliated colleges of ROUHS to take further necessary steps.

Dr. Y. Bharath Shetty, Member of Senate deliberated on the issue of remuneration for staff working in examination related works and suggested for early disbursement of remuneration to improve the efficiency of working environment. Prof. Sai Kumar, Dr. Ravindra Banakar and other members of Senate also opined the same. Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor informed the members that University is working on implementing Finance Management System to facilitate early disbursement of remuneration and deduction of TDS and other finance related matters.

Dr. Pandu, Member of Senate deliberated on the issue of examinership to conduct practical examination under medical stream. He opined that for RS4 Scheme the second internal examiner is from the same college. However, he suggested appointing second Internal examiner from other colleges affiliated to RGUHS. He also suggested appointing Internal examiner with 4 years of teaching experience as Assistant Professor. Currently, Assistant Professors with 5 years of teaching experience are considered for the same. Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor informed the members that necessary action will be taken as per the apex body norms.

Dr. Mahendra S, Member of Senate briefed about the appointment of Reader as Post Graduate Practical examiner. Currently, only the Professors are considered for appointment as Post Graduate Practical Examiner, however, Readers are also guiding Post Graduate students. Hence, Readers should be considered. Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor deliberated on the matter and informed the members that necessary action will be taken as per the apex body norms.

Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor informed the members that 'Foreign Student Admission Cell' will be established at the University and guidelines will be framed to oversee the admissions of Foreign Students to the affiliated colleges.
