SUBJECT NO.213/1:**CONFIRMATION OF MINUTES OF 212th MEETING OF THE SYNDICATE (SPECIAL) HELD ON 23.03.2026 AT BENGALURU.**

DELIBERATION: Dr. Ramanath G P expressed his concern regarding recommendation of disproportionate of seats in Government Medical colleges and hence urged the Syndicate what action needs to be taken regarding the matter. The Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor suggest to give a written representation and the same will be sent to the Government on behalf of the Syndicate.

The Syndicate members also raised the issue that surprise inspections to be done in few colleges after the NMC grants seats. HVC mentioned that there is provision for the same and can be done as and when required.

Adding to that Dr. Kirankumar S Kulageri, Dr. B K Madhusudhan, Prof. C Obul Reddy and Dr. Mailareshwar J Jeevannavar focused on post-graduate medical seat allocation and surgical training guidelines. The discussion centered around ensuring appropriate surgical experience for PG students, with suggestions to define specific procedure requirements for different years of training. The Syndicate agreed to review and update guidelines for surgical training, with emphasis on quality over quantity of procedures. Also, recommended for enforcement of maintaining of logbook for every postgraduate student.

The Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor informed that BOS shall be entrusted to framing the guidelines with emphasis on hands on training for postgraduate medical students and the same shall be placed before the Syndicate.

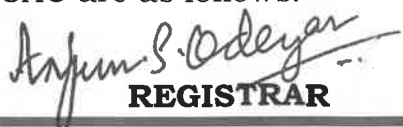

The TA & DA Application is mobile-responsive and integrated with UIMS to ensure accuracy, efficiency, and transparency in TA & DA claims. Its key features include: a) Standardized claim processing workflows as per RGUHS norms b) Automated allowance calculation c) Multi-level approval workflow d) Status tracking e) Role-based access control f) Auto-calculation engine g) Validation rules (eligibility, duplication checks) - h). API for distance calculation i) Configurable rate systems, bulk claim processing, approval locking, and audit trails 3. Queries received from the centres are addressed and resolved on an ongoing basis. 4. Efforts are underway to enhance the interface, making it more flexible and user-friendly.

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	5. We are working on providing various reports related to this service for the centres. 6. This service may be extended to other courses based on inputs received from the concerned faculty or sections. 7. Currently, mobile application developers are not available. Once developers are hired, a native mobile application can be developed. The service is seamless integrated with UIMS to capture exam centres, affiliated colleges, and examiners for specific dates, thereby improving transparency, eliminating manual calculation errors, and enabling faster claim processing. At present, there is no native mobile application for Android or iOS due to the unavailability of developers with the required technology stack.
