

KAMIL-E-TIB-WA-JARAHAT

[Bachelor of Unani Medicine and Surgery]

Degree Course

[As per the central Council of Indian Medicine (Minimum standards of Education in Indian Medicine) Amendment Regulations, 2016] (Applicable for students admitted from 2016-17)

Section-1

Regulations

1. Eligibility for admission

A. Qualification

1) Candidate seeking admission to Kamil-E-Tib-Wa-Jarahat(Bachelor of Unani Medicine and Surgery-B.U.M.S) Degree Course must have passed pre university education, Karnataka State, with English as one of the subjects and Physics, Chemistry & Biology individually and must have obtained a minimum of not less than 50% marks taken together in Physics, Chemistry & Biology in the qualifying examination. In respect of candidates belonging to Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and other Backward Classes, the marks obtained in Physics, Chemistry and Biology taken together in qualifying examination be 40% instead of 50% as above. The candidate should have passed 10th standard with Urdu or Arabic or Persian language as a subject, or clear the test of Urdu in the entrance examination conducted by the University or Board or registered Society authorized by the Government to conduct such examination.

Or

2) Shall have passed any other examination conducted by Boards/Councils/ Intermediate education established by State Government/Central Government and recognized as equivalent to two year Pre University Examination by the Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences/Association of Indian Universities (AIU), with English as one of the subjects and Physics, Chemistry, Biology as optional subjects and the candidates shall have passed subjects of English, Physics and Biology individually and must obtain a minimum of less than 50% marks taken together in Physics, Chemistry & Biology in the qualifying examination. In respect of candidates belonging to Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and other Backward Classes, the marks obtained in Physics, Chemistry and Biology taken together in qualifying examination be 40% instead of 50% as above. The

candidate should have passed 10th standard with Urdu or Arabic or Persian language as a subject, or clear the test of Urdu in the entrance examination conducted by the University or Board or registered Society authorized by the Government to conduct such examination.

B. Minimum Age

Candidates should attain the age of seventeen years as on 1st December of the year of admission to BUMS Course.

2. Entrance/Selection Test

Selection of the candidates should be based on the merit determined on the basis of entrance examination held by University or competent authority.

3. Duration of course –

The duration of the course shall be five and half years including one year compulsory internship.

4. Degree to be awarded:

Kamil-E-Tib-Wa-Jarahat (Bachelor of Unani Medicine and Surgery-B.U.M.S)

5. Medium of instruction:

(a)The medium of instruction shall be Urdu, substantiated with English where ever necessary.

(b)Necessary modern advancement shall be incorporated in the course of studies. In such cases terminology shall be standard modern terminology with -Arabic/Urdu equivalents. For Unani,the terminology shall essentially remain Unani terminology..

6. Minimum Attendance:

- a) Minimum of 75% of Attendance in the Theory and Practicals in each subject is required to be eligible for examination at the end of each professional subject to the condition that progress and conduct of the candidate is considered satisfactory by the Principal.
- b) The Principal should notify at the college, the attendance details at the end of each term without fail under intimation to the university. c) A Candidate lacking in the prescribed attendance and progress insubject(s)inTheoryPracticals/Clinicainthefirst appearance should not be permitted to appear for the examination in that subject(s).

7. **Course of Study:**

B) Internal Assessment:

- Regular periodic tests shall be conducted in each phase and in each subject. Although the number of tests to be conducted is left to the discretion of the institution, there shall be a minimum of three internal assessment tests to be held in each phase/year.
- Teaching faculty in the grade of Assistant Professor and above or Lecturer with five years of teaching experience can conduct internal assessment tests.
- Proper record of the work should be maintained which will be the basis of all students' internal assessment and should be available for scrutiny.
- The average of the best two internal assessment marks shall be taken into consideration and sent to the University.
- A Student must secure at least 50% of the marks assigned for internal assessment in a particular subject in order to be eligible to appear in the University examination of that subject.
- The Internal Assessment marks of both theory and practical obtained by the candidate should be displayed on the notice board of the institution for information of students.
- The Internal Assessment marks of both theory and practical obtained by the candidate should be sent to University at least fifteen days prior to the commencement of university examination.
- Internal Assessment marks shall not be considered for declaring results of University examination of a candidate. However, the Internal Assessment Marks shall be added to the marks obtained by a candidate in theory and practical/clinical in the University examination for determining the class. (Please see Declaration of Class).

8. Scheme of Examination:

(1)(A.) The first professional session shall ordinarily start in July and the first professional examination shall be at the end of one academic year of first professional session;

(B) The first professional examination shall be held in the following subjects, namely:-

- (i) Arabic and Mantiq wa falsafa (Logic and Philosophy);
- (ii) Kulliyat Umoore Tabiya (Basic Principles of Unani Medicine);
- (iii) Tashreehul Badan (Anatomy);
- (iv) Maunafe ul Aza (Physiology);

(C) The failed student of first professional shall be allowed to appear in second professional examination, but the student shall not be allowed to appear in third professional examination unless the student passes all the subject of first professional examination and maximum four chances shall be given to pass first professional examination within a period of maximum three years.

(2) (A) The Second professional session shall start every year in the month of July following completion of first professional examination and the second professional examination shall be ordinarily held and completed by the end of month of May or June every year after completion of one year of second professional session;

(B) The second professional examination shall be held in the following subjects, namely:-

- (i) Tareekhe Tib (History of Medicine);
- (ii) tahaffuzi wa Samaji Tib (Preventive and Community Medicine);
- (iii) Ilmul Advia (Pharmacology);
- (iv) Mahiyatul Amraz (Pathology);

(C) The failed student of second professional who have passed all the subjects of first professional examination shall be allowed to appear in third professional examination, but the student shall not be allowed to appear in final professional examination unless the student passes all the subjects of second professional examination and maximum four chances shall be given to pass second professional examination within a period of maximum three years.

(3) (A) The third professional session shall start every year in the month of July following completion of second professional examination and the third professional examination shall be ordinarily held and completed by the end of the month of May or June every year after completion of one year of third professional session;

Assessment marks in each subject in theory and practical/clinical. A failed candidate may appear in the subsequent First Professional Examination.

A student failed in not more than two subjects shall be held eligible to keep the terms for the second Professional session however he shall not be allowed to appear or second professional examination unless he passes in all the subjects of the first professional examination.

(2) Second professional session--(a) The second professional examination shall be held after one year of Second Professional Course, i.e. after completion of a minimum of two years of total study.

A candidate is eligible to appear for the Second BUMS Examination at the end of twelve months of Second Professional Course provided he/she has 75% attendance in both Theory and Practical classes from the date of commencement of the course, specified in the calendar of events of Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, and has obtained a minimum of 50% of Internal Assessment marks in the Second Professional subjects. Those who fail shall appear in the subsequent Second Professional Examination

A student failed in not more than two subjects shall be held eligible to keep the terms for the third professional session, however he shall not be allowed to appear for third professional examination unless he passes in all the subjects of second professional examination.

3) Third professional session-

The Third professional examination will be held at the end of 12 months of Third Professional Course.

Only those candidates who have passed in all the subjects in First and Second Professional Examinations shall be allowed to take the Third Professional Examination, provided he/she has 75% attendance in both Theory and Practical classes from the date of commencement of the Course, specified in the calendar of events of Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, and has obtained a minimum of 50% of Internal Assessment marks in the Third Professional Subjects. Those who fail shall appear in subsequent Third Professional Examination.

A student failed in not more than two subjects shall be held eligible to keep the terms for the final professional examination however he shall not be allowed to appear for final professional examination unless he passes in all the subjects of third professional examination

(4) Final professional session—The Final professional examination will be held at the end of 18 months of Final Professional Course.

(B) The third professional examination shall be held in the following subjects, namely:-

- (i) Communication Skills;
- (ii) Ilmul Saidala wa Murakkabat (Pharmacy)
- (iii) Tibbe Qanooni wa Ilmul Samoom (Jurisprudence and Toxicology);
- (iv) Sareeriyat wa Usoole Ilaj (Clinical Methods);
- (v) Ilaj bit Tadbeer (Regimenal Therapy);
- (vi) Ilmul Atfal (paediatrics);

(C) The failed student of third professional who have passed all the subject of first and second professional examinations shall be allowed to appear in final professional examination and maximum four chances shall be given to pass third professional examination within a period of maximum three years.

(4) (A) The final Professional session shall be of one year and six months duration and shall start every year in the month of July following completion of third professional examination and the final professional examination shall be ordinarily held and completed by the end of the month of December every year after completion of one year and six months of final professional session;

(B) The first professional examination shall comprise of the following subjects, namely:-

- (i) Moalajat (General Medicine);
- (ii) Amraze Niswan (gynaecology);
- (iii) Ilmul Qabala wa Naumaulood (Obstetrics and Neonatology);
- (iv) Ilmul jarahat (surgery);
- (v) Ain, Uzn, Anf, Halaq wa Asnan (Eye, Ear, Nose, Throat and Dentistry);
- (vi) Amraze Jild wa Tazeeniyat;

(C) The student failed in any of the four professional examination in four chances shall not be allowed to continue his or her studies;

Provided that, in case of serious personal illness of a student and in any unavoidable circumstances, the Vice-Chancellor of the concerned University may provide one more chance in anyone of four professional examination;

(D) To become eligible for joining the compulsory internship programme, all four professional examination shall be passed within a period of maximum nine years including all chances as mentioned above.

A Eligibility to appear for Examination

A candidate eligible to appear for the First B.U.M.S. Examination at the end of twelve months of course provided he/she has 75% attendance in both Theory and Practical classes from the date of commencement of the course, specified in the calendar of events of Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences.

A candidate is eligible to appear for the First B.U.M.S. Examination at the end of twelve months of course provided he/she has obtained a minimum of 50% of Internal

Only those candidates who have passed in all the subjects in First, Second and Third Professional Examinations shall be allowed to take the Final Professional Examination, provided he/she has 75% attendance in both theory and practical classes from the date of commencement of the Course, specified in the calendar of events of Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, and has obtained a minimum of 50% of Internal Assessment marks in the Third Professional Subjects. Failed students of final professional examination will be eligible for appearing in subsequent supplementary examination.

D. Criteria for passing

For declaration of pass in a subject in the university examination, a candidate shall appear in each subject in all Theory papers and practical/clinical and viva-voce examination as the case may be, and

Shall secure a minimum of 50% of the prescribed marks for university examination in theory and Practical/Clinical including Viva-Voce examination, as stipulated in the marks distribution Tables IX, X, XI and XII and in the subjects which are comprised of two papers and have one common practical; the criteria of passing the theory papers will be decided on the basis of achieving fifty per cent marks in aggregate of both the Papers.

If a candidate is failed in the theory or practical exam, he shall be required to appear in supplementary examination in theory as well as practical also.

In those subjects which do not have a practical component, 50%marks shall be obtained in Theory and Viva-voce separately.

In those subjects which have only theory component, 50% marks shall be obtained in theory only.

Internal Assessment marks shall not be added to the marks obtained in university examination for determination of pass.

E. Declaration of Results

- (a) The classification for declaration of class will be on the basis of aggregate of I, II, III and Final professional examinations provided candidate has passed in first attempt.
- (b) For computing of marks for determining class, marks obtained in the Internal Assessment in Theory and Practical/Clinical shall be added to the aggregate marks obtained in university examination.
- (c) A candidate having appeared in all the subjects in the same examination in first attempt and secures 75% of marks or more in the aggregate in the first attempt will be declared to have passed the examination with Distinction.
- (d) A candidate having appeared in all the subjects in the same examination in the first attempt and secures 60% marks or more but less than 75% of marks in the aggregate in the first attempt will be declared to have passes the examination in First Class.

- (e) A candidate having appeared in all the subjects in the same examination in the first attempt and secures 50% and more, but less than 60% of the marks in the grand total aggregate in the first attempt shall be declared to have passed the examination in Second Class.
- (f) A candidate passing a university examination in more than one attempt shall be placed in Pass Class irrespective of the percentage of marks secured by him/her in the examination.

Please note fraction of marks should not be rounded off for clauses (c), (d) or (e)]

9. Educational Tour

There shall be one Educational Tour for the Final Professional students to impart better clinical knowledge by visiting Hospitals and Medical Institutions in India.

10. Miscellaneous

A. Migration or transfer of students

- (a) A student studying in a recognized Unani Medical College may be allowed to migrate / transfer to any other recognized Unani Medical college under another / same University.
- (b) The migration / transfer can be allowed by the university concerned within 1 month after the announcement of results of First B.U.M.S examination. However migration /transfer should be avoided in the middle of any year in no case before the completion of First BUMS examination.
- (c) The number of students migrating / transferring from one Unani Medical College to another Unani Medical College during one year will be kept to minimum but should not exceed the limit of 5% of its intake subject to a maximum of five students in any one Unani Medical College in a year.

B. Readmission of Candidates who discontinued the course

A candidate who discontinues the course is eligible for readmission subject to the following conditions:

1. Provision for readmission is only once during the entire course.
2. He / She should seek admission within 3 years from the date of discontinuation of the course.
3. He / She should pay the prescribed fee for the year for which he / she seeks admission and cannot claim re-admission on the strength of fee paid earlier.
4. If the candidate discontinues after the university examination he / she should re appear for the subject in which he / she has failed before seeking admission to the next higher classes by paying examination fee.
5. He / She should put two terms of attendance in the phase for which he / she seeks admission before appearing for the university examinations, provided, in

case the candidate leaves in the middle of the first term, he / she will have to complete the prescribed three terms of that phase *de novo*.

11. Compulsory Internship - After Passing the Final Professional Examination, each student shall be posted for Rotatory Compulsory Internship in Recognized Institutions / Hospital for -

- 4 Months in the Department of Moalejat including Ilaj-bit-Tadbeer
- 1 Month in the Department of Tahaffuz-e-Samaj-e-Tibb(Hifzan-e-Sehat)
- 2 Months in the Department of Jarahat
- 2 Months in the Department of Amraz-e-Ain-Uzn-o-Anaf-o-Halaq, and
- 2 Months in the Department of Ilmul-Qabala-o-Niswan
- 1 Month in the Department of Amraz Atfal
